Introduction

This is the desire of my heart before the Lord: that the presentation of the talk would give a clear interpretation of the symbolic vocabulary worked out and worked into every colour chosen and each piece shaped in order to express the direct correlation between visual composition and spiritual concept. My constant prayer has been, (and continues to be), that the Lord Himself would cause this work to honour and "adorn the doctrine of God our Saviour." Titus 2:10.

There is a paradox of celebration in stained glass: physically static, visually lively. Set upon shelf or bench, colours lose their identity, but held up before the light, this medium of cooled melted sand glows into life at sun-rise, and day after day pours forth speech in silent tongues, mutely declaring the Creator of sand, and light, and of all things, visible and invisible.

Knowing that I do not deserve the least of His blessings, it is mysterious privilege and 'grace abounding' to have been given glimpses of a God-purposed place where I have walked in wonders beyond myself as one of His artisans - a craftsman, and designer — and, peculiar to this art form too - an embroiderer, in blue, and purple and scarlet. (Exodus 38:23).

In 1993, plans were going ahead for the building of Bow Valley Baptist Church. Pastor Hamish Buntain asked me a question: "Christine, would you like to think about glass for the Cross?"

O my soul, the breadth and length and depth and height of the perfect love of God in Christ!²

.The LORD said, "Seek ye My face." My heart said, "Thy face will I seek."³

Jesus said, "Everything that is written by the prophets about the Son of Man will be *fulfilled*. He will be handed over to the Gentiles. They will mock Him, insult Him, spit on Him, flog Him, and kill Him. On the third day He will rise again."

Jesus Christ our Saviour has abolished death and has brought life and immortality to light through the gospel.⁵

By the manifold grace of God,⁶ the Cross was unveiled in the original sanctuary, during the Morning Worship Service, April 4th, 1999.

Could it be that, on this April Sunday, 2009, 10 years later, you and I, and these stones of coloured light, will truly share a bond and a language whose witness will not be muted?

I pray so, for the old rugged Cross lights our path to glory.⁷

There is a crimson thread that can be traced as a continuity of oneness from Genesis through to the Book of Revelation. The blood-red of Redemption sings its throbbing tones, as one, with the recurring scarlet red of Holy flame: "Is not My Word like a fire?" asks the LORD of Majestic Glory.

And so, it was indeed *necessay*¹⁰ to employ the primary power of *red* to blaze forth in honour of Jesus the Christ, ¹¹ for it is in Christ, and through the shedding of His precious blood¹² that *we* have forgiveness and Redemption, ¹³ and Peace with God. ¹⁴

Speaking to His disciples, then - and now - Jesus said, "I am the True Vine, and you are the branches; abide in Me, and I in you." ¹⁵

These words form the basis of the composition within the 9' vertical of the Cross.

The crimson-ruby images have been cut and set in a manner of positioning in order that they may suggest an ongoing walk of life with the Lord, by an upward progressive pace reflecting this word of God to us, "live in the Spirit; walk in the Spirit, live in the Spirit, walk in the Spirit," ¹⁶ telling of the living and growing, Divinely restored relationship of love which we have with God our Heavenly Father, through faith in Jesus Christ. ¹⁷

Wheresoever glass-light is crimson, ruby, red, read: Saviour 18

Blue is a colour of power too, second only to red. Blue can shine like a psalm of thanksgiving melody, or picture shy and trembling notes of little-faith before the sapphire throne of grace and mercy, ¹⁹ or carry rich, Prussian-blue tones like the bass voice of thunder.

Because blue is the colour having affinity with Jesus' reference to "things heavenly", ²⁰ and because of living by trust in His Word, ²¹ blue is symbolic of *faith*. Where glass-light holds a measure of blue, read: *faith*. ²³

Jesus said, "I am from above . . . I am not of this world." In John chapter 7, verse 39, 25 Jesus spoke of the Spirit which they that believe on Him should receive, and the image which is symbolic of the Presence of the Holy Spirit is set at the apex of the vertical, right at the very top, where an inwardly curving piece of antique white glass describes light flowing in from above.

This inwardly-receiving from above, ²⁶ and the abiding Presence of the Holy Spirit in the believer, ²⁷ is acknowledged and honoured by variously shaped, unregimented 'flares' of antique whites - in various, and sudden appearing places throughout the vertical of the Cross, based upon Jesus' teaching in John chapter 3, that the Holy Spirit operates far above and beyond any earthly control, ²⁸ but always according to the good and perfect will of God. ²⁹

Where glass light is of antique whites, read: Holy Spirit.

Stained glass is seen to come alive with light - and dies without it. So would we. The strong-seeming, but fragile 'body' of a piece of glass offers a comparison to our "earthen vessel," ³⁰ which also is strong-seeming, but, in reality, is frail.

In Genesis chapter 2, it is written that the LORD God formed man of the dust of the ground and "breathed into man's nostrils the breath of life." ³¹

Glass is formed mainly from sand, which is *the dust* of earth's rock and stone, and, in the *antique method* of hand-made, mouth-blown glassmaking, a craftsman blows *his* breath into a 'gather' of molten sand.³² This analogy of stained glass ³³ and Christian pilgrim³⁴ can be taken further in that whilst glass displays the *temporal* light of the sun.³⁵ we are indwelt by the *eternal* light of the Son of Righteousness.³⁶

Believers in Jesus Christ are described in 1 Peter as *living stones*, being built up as a spiritual house.³⁷ . . *living stones* - does that remind you that every sheet of glass has been formed from many grains of stone? Each piece of glass here has been chosen, cut and shaped – and I must say, prayed over - to form uniquely fitting relationships with its neighbours.

This building up together of every piece of glass, or *lively stone*, is made secure on every side by strips of lead . . . a reminder of the words in Ephesians 4:16: "being supplied and held together by the joints and ligaments, growing with a growth which is from God." At one and the same time the connecting leads both join the pieces *and* set them apart, thus presenting a visible Scriptural analogy that, "We, who are many, are one body in Christ, and *individually*, members one of another." ³⁸

The 'arms' of the crossbeam, or *patibulum*, are visualized as illuminated psalms of praise and thanksgiving.³⁹ The designs concentrate upon the Biblical plant, the pomegranate,⁴⁰ whose fruit, like a globe *fill*ed with seeds, refers well to multiplicity in unity; again, "we who are many, are one body in Christ."

The flower of the pomegranate plant has the curving shape of a trumpet⁴¹- the Bible's most mentioned musical instrument. The left and right designs offer a psalmic sense of parallelism, well described, as 'the same in the other' – as are *hands*, left and right, lifted up to God in prayer and thanksgiving.⁴²

The pomegranate offers a third component of spiritual symbolism; the garnet-red globe of the fruit has a unique calyx structure at its top, and the triangular spiky lobes resemble -a crown.

The Head that once was crowned with thorns, is crowned with glory now.

"Christ is the visible image of the invisible God, and in Him dwells all the fullness of the Godhead bodily."⁴⁴

God on high is nigh.⁴⁵

The crucifixion of Christ brought to fulfillment⁴⁶ God's purposed meeting of time, place, and Eternity⁴⁷; and it came about that *this* Jesus,⁴⁸ the Head of His church,⁴⁹ had His hands outstretched and nailed to a criminal's cross,⁵⁰ causing Jesus' head to mark forever the definable intersection of the vertical and horizontal beams.⁵¹

There are seven⁵² elements set within this centre square. Each image touches with a humble boldness upon the infinite mystery of "the fullness of the Godhead bodily".⁵³

The star of Christ's Nativity⁵⁴ is etched into the top left corner of the square. This star, symbol of "the light that shone when Hope was born"⁵⁵ is a seven-pointed star, in order to ascribe honour to the risen Lord Jesus Christ, who is the seven-horned Lamb of power.⁵⁶

A blood-red 'cross' is formed by four 'nails', ⁵⁷ which form a continuing reminder that Jesus was "pierced through for *our* transgressions". ⁵⁸ Those four ruby-glass nail-points create an 'X' which becomes the symbol for the fifth wound, often referred to as the heart-wound of Christ's true humanity, the wound caused by the spear thrust into His side. ⁵⁹

There is a depiction of the Sacred Monogram, which is a design amalgam of the first two Greek letters of *Christos,* the X and the P. 'Poetic license' has been taken to extend the curve of the letter 'P' to form a shape reminiscent of a shepherd's crook which carries the profound significance of Jesus' words: "I am the Good Shepherd, I give My life for the sheep." ⁶⁰

Only Jesus, the Good and Great Shepherd could hold together contraries, for He is the Lamb of God. 61

There was particular choosing in the foundational piece for the square. 62

It was cut from a sheet of antique "streaky" blue-on-white glass to re-present an image of the veil of the temple which was rent from top to bottom at the moment of Christ's death, ⁶³ allowing us to enter the Most Holy Place by a new and living Way. ⁶⁴

Jesus' undiminished Deity is declared by the Greek initial letters of Alpha and Omega: "I am the first and the last; the beginning and the end." ⁶⁵

And there is a further meaning to the golden 'X' symbol, derived from the mustard seed,⁶⁶ which produces a plant whose flowers have four petals, displaying the form of a cross.

The Holy Seed is the Word of God, ⁶⁷ who died for us that we may live together with Him. "Because I live, you will live also." ⁶⁸

The design intention of the elliptical curves at the four wide ends of the ruby nails-cross is to touch upon the unbounded Sovereignty of God.⁶⁹ These curved lines represent 'parabolas' - they are open curves which *imply* infinite extent, and are a reminder that, "God's Kingdom will have no end." ⁷⁰

For God, who commanded the light to shine out of darkness, hath shined in our hearts, to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.⁷¹

The LORD bless you and keep you;
The LORD make His face shine upon you,
And be gracious to you,
The LORD lift up His countenance upon you,
And give you peace.⁷²
